**FRANKLYN QUTEH WINS 2013 HILL TROPHY
AS DIVISION II FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

FLORENCE, Ala. -- Bloomsburg (Pa.) University senior running back **Franklyn Quiteh** claimed the Harlon Hill Trophy Friday as the 2013 Division II College Football Player of the Year.

Quiteh, a three-time Hill Trophy Finalist, received 182 total points and held a 36-point margin over West Texas A&M University quarterback **Dustin Vaughan**. Henderson State (Ark.) University junior quarterback **Kevin Rodgers** was third with 100 points.

The award winner is determined in voting by the Division II sports information directors and was presented in front of a crowd of 400 at the 28th annual Harlon Hill Trophy award banquet at the Marriott Shoals Conference Center.

The Harlon Hill Trophy is sponsored by the **City of Florence, Florence-Lauderdale Tourism, Opti-Net, Marriott Shoals Hotel and Spa and Herff Jones.**

Quiteh, from Tobyhanna, Pa., led Division II in rushing yards (2,195), rushing yards per game (182.9), rushing touchdowns (29) and scoring (15.7) in 2013. He led Bloomsburg to 10-2 record and to the second round of the Division II Playoffs. He is the first player in Division II history to rush for more than 2,000 yards in a season three times in his career and he also broke the Division II record for most game with more than 100 yards rushing with 42.

Quiteh finished his career as the second leading rusher in Division II history with 7,523.

He finished third in the 2012 Hill voting and sixth in 2010.

Quiteh is the second straight winner from a school in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and the PSAC's fourth overall winner. He is also the second Hill Trophy winner from Bloomsburg, joining 1997 recipient Irvin Sigler.

Following Quiteh, Vaughan and Rodgers in the voting were senior quarterback Bo Cordell of Tusculum (57), senior running back Rondell White of West Chester (56), senior quarterback Jon Wolf of Minnesota State-Mankato (35), senior running back Glen Clinton of Chadron State (17), senior running back Tyler Tonderum of Southwest Minnesota State (13) and senior quarterback Luke Charles from UNC Pembroke (12).

The Hill Trophy is named for a former University of North Alabama player - the late Harlon Hill - who was a standout with the Lions from 1950-53 before going on to fame in the National Football League with the Chicago Bears.

North Dakota State quarterback Jeff Bentrin won the initial Hill Trophy in 1986, before Texas A&M-Kingsville running back Johnny Bailey won three straight Hill trophies from 1987-89.

Another North Dakota State quarterback, Chris Simdorn, claimed the 1990 award, followed by Pittsburg State's Ronnie West in 1991 and Ronald Moore in 1992, New Haven running back Roger Graham in 1993, Valdosta State quarterback Chris Hatcher in 1994, North Alabama linebacker Ronald McKinnon in 1995, Truman State running back Jarrett Anderson in 1996, Bloomsburg running back Irvin Sigler in 1997, Emporia State running back Brian Shay in 1998, Northern Colorado quarterback Corte McGuffey in 1999, Valdosta State quarterback Dusty Bonner in 2000 and 2001, and Grand Valley State quarterback Curt Anes in 2002. University of North Alabama senior quarterback Will Hall claimed the trophy in 2003. Colorado-Mines quarterback Chad Frieauf took the trophy in 2004, East Stroudsburg's Jimmy Terwilliger in 2005, Chadron State's Danny Woodhead in 2006 and 2007 and Abilene Christian's Bernard Scott in 2008. Wayne State (Mich.) running back Joique Bell won the 2009 Hill Trophy, followed by Central Missouri quarterback Eric Czerniewski in 2010, Mars Hill running back Jonas Randolph in 2011 and Shippensburg State quarterback Zach Zulli in 2012.
